THE CHARTER OF INCORPORATION OF THE ROSEDALE COMPRESS COMPANY.

BE IT KNOWN, That ALBERT S. CALDWELL, H.T. CALDWELL, R.W. HARRIS, J.E. HUTCHINSON, A.W. BENOIT, and CHARLES SCOTT, under and by virtue of the laws of the State of Mississippi, are hereby ~~en~~ constituted a body politic and corporate, by the name and style of "THE ROSEDALE COMPRESS COMPANY", for the purpose of compressing, storing, buying, selling and ginning cotton, and for the purpose of acting as general warehouse men for cotton and cotton-seed. Said Company shall have full power to rent, or purchase buildings and machinery, and to do all other acts necessary or proper to carrying out the purpose of the corporation.

The domicile of said corporation shall be in or near the town of Rosedale, Bolivar County Mississippi, and the said corporation shall have perpetual succession for the period of fifty years.

The Capital Stock of this corporation shall be Fifty-Five Thousand (55,000) Dollars, divided into shares of One Hundred (100) Dollars each.

The foregonig proposed charter of incorporation is respectfully referred to the Honorable Attorney General for his advice as to the constitutionality and legality of the provisions thereof.
