By A. G. McNutt, Governor of Mississippi.

WHEREAS, the Penitentiary of this State is now in readiness to receive Convicts-Now know ye, that in consequence thereof, and by virtue of authority in me vested by the Constitution and Laws of the State, I do issue this my Proclamation, "requiring all persons sentenced to imprisonment therein to be conveyed thereto," and delivered to the Superintendent and Principal Keeper of the said Penitentiary. A copy of the sentence of the Court, under the seal thereof, duly certified by the Clerk, alone authorizes the Superintendent and Principal Keeper to re ceive convicts.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, I. ALEXANDER G. McNUTT Governor of the State aforesaid, have caused these letters to be made patent, and the Great Seal of the State to be hereunto affixed.
