GOV. McNUTT OF MISSISSIPPI.

To this gentleman belongs the distinguished notoriety of being the first public functionary in his station, who has officially recommended the people of this country to violate the pledged faith of their government, and escape the fulfilment of an obligation which he himself had asserted they were bound to discharge. In his Message last year, he said:—"The faith of the State is pledged for the whole capital stock of the Union Bank, and the property of all her citizens may hereafter be taxed to make up the defalcations." This year he says—"The Executive has never admitted the validity of the sale of the State Bonds of the Union Bank," and counsels the Legislature to rob the holders of them, by refusing to pay either principal or interest. And upon what grounds? Why, says the Governor, in substance, the Bonds are owned by the United States Bank; the United States Bank is an infernal scoundrel; no one will suffer but this scoundrel—therefore we need not tax ourselves to pay the debt. This is the plain English of that portion of his Excellency's message. A more disgraceful proposition was never submitted to the Representatives of a free people. It will give to Governor McNutt, as a Statesman and politician, an immortality of infamy.

We are glad to see the people of Mississippi are every where indignantly repudiating the wholesale system of robbery, which McNutt recommended to their adoption, and that they are determined, cost what it may, to maintain the honor and faith of the State. There is, without doubt, even now, a decided majority in the Legislature in favor of making any and every sacrifice, to avert the indelible disgrace, which the fell spirit of ultra locofocoism would bring upon the people and government of Mississippi. The coming elections will increase that majority, by the return of members from whig counties now represented by men attached to the McNutt faction. A better day is dawning upon the character and credit of Mississippi. The charlatans who have brought her to the verge of ruin, will soon be expelled from all control over her destiny. Her honor and her faith will be vindicated before the world, and with her vast resources and recuperative energies, she will soon emerge from the low condition to which she has been brought by the political quackery
