**WHIG CONVENTION.**

According to previous notice, this body  
assembled at the Capitol on monday, the  
first day of February, 1841.

The meeting was called to order by the  
Hon. T. Jones Steward of Amite County.

Col. Alfred Cox, of the city of Vicksburg,  
was unanimously elected President, and on  
motion of Gustavus H. Wilcox, Esq. of  
Jefferson, Richard M. Corwine, of Yazoo  
was appointed Secetary.

The President then addressed the Con-  
vention upon the subject of its organization;  
and in a feeling and handsome manner re-  
turned thanks, for the honor conferred upon  
him.

On motion of Mr. McCardle, the delegates  
from the different coties in attendance were  
invited to come forward and record their  
names with the Secetary when delegates  
from the following counties appeared, to  
wit.

Adams, Amite, Bolivar, Copiah,  
Carroll, Covington, Claiborne, Costuma-  
De Soto, Franklin, Hinds, Holmes, Hau-  
cock, Itawamba, Jefferson, Jasper, Lafayette-  
Lowndes, Leake, Marshall, Madison, Mon-  
roe, Noxubee, Neshoba, Octibbeha, Pike,  
Pontotoc, Perry, Panola, Rankin, Simpson,  
Tippah, Tallahassee, Wilkinson, Warren,  
Winston, Washington, Yazoo, and Yallo-  
busha.

On motion of J. H. Rollins, esq. of madi-
