On motion of J. H. Rollins, esq. of madi-
son, the following resolution was adopted:
Resolved, That during the deliberations
of this Convention the rules which govern
the deliberations of the House of Represent-
atives be adopted as the rules by which the
Convention shall be governed.
W. R. Miller, esq. of Yazoo, offered the
following resolutions, to wit:
1st *Resolved*, That a nominating com-
mittee be appointed.
2d. *Resolved*. That the nominating com-
mittee of this convention be composed of two
members from each senatorial district.
3d. *Resolved*, That the members on the
nominating committee be elected by the del-
egates from the respective Senatorial Dis-
tricts.
4th. *Resolved*, That in order to obtain a
full, honest and faithful expression of the
public feeling as to the choice of candidates,
the members of the nominating committee
shall be compelled to obey all instructions
from the delegation by whom they are sev-
erally elected.
On motion of W. Y. Gholson, esq. of
Pontotoc, the following resolution was offer-
ed as a substitute for the original, which
was adopted.
Resolved, That the delegates from each
county represented in the Convention shall
select from their number one person, and
the person so selected shall constitute a nom-
inating committee
That said nominating committee shall
present to the convention the names of suit-
able persons as candidates for Governor,
members of Congress and other State officers
That said nominating committee, in se-
lecting such persons, shall allow to each
member of the committee as many votes as
the county they represent is entitled to mem-
bers in the House of Representatives.
Aaron Lindsey, esq. offered the follow-
