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n a manner which clearly indicated the  
warinth and sincerity of his own feelings.—  
This he did on the most brilliant day of his  
life; the day of his inauguration and record-  
ed it, which will long be treasured in the  
archives of his country—his inaugural ad-  
dress. His words are these:—"I deem the  
present occasion sufficiently important and  
solemn to justify me in expressing to my  
fellw citizens, a profound reverence for the  
christian religion, and a thorough convic-  
tion, that sound morals, religious liberty, and  
a just sense of religious responsibility are  
essentially connected with all true happiness,  
and," continues he—"to that good Being  
who has blessed us with the gifts of civil and  
religious freedom,—who watched over and  
prospered the labors of our fathers, and has  
hitherto preserved to us, institutions, far ex-  
ceeding in excellence those of any other peo-  
ple—let us unite in commending every in-  
terest of our Beloved Country, in all future  
time." This is a noble testimony just in con-  
formity with the uniform cha acter of the  
venerable man, and as we believe in exact  
accordance, also; with the deep seated feel-  
ings of his heart, Long an habitual and  
devout worshipper in the house of God—he  
had, for some years past, become more and  
more impressed with the importance of per-  
sonal piety, and for many months before his  
departure, it was his invariable practice to  
read the scriptures, every night, however  
harassed by company, or worn down by  
fatigue—This we have since learned has  
been his practice for the last twenty years:—  
and since his inauguration, an individual  
having entered his chamber, one morning at a  
very early hour, found him devoutly engaged  
in the study of the same blessed volume—  
and, we are told, that on *Thursday* night,  
before he died he repeated a passage from  
Isaiah, to one sitting on his bed side, remark-  
ing that it had made an impression on his  
mind, which he had never been able to efface  
or fully to understand—The pasage is this,  
"He calleth to me out of Seir,  
"Watchman, what of the night? Watchman,  
what of the night?"  
"The watchman said, the morning cometh, and  
also the night! if ye will inquire, inquire ye; re-  
turn, come."

It seems that Gen-  
eral Harrison's religious course, properly  
speaking, commenced during a season of  
domestic affliction, when he was called to  
mourn over the death of a beloved son, some  
two years ago—It was his wish to connect  
himself with the church of Christ by a  
public profession, about a year since, but,  
being a candidate for the Presidency, he  
feared his motives might be misapprehended,  
and he put it off—after his inauguration the  
way was open, and he actually fixed upon  
the very day, for making this public profess-  
ion of his faith in Christ, but it proved to be  
the very Sabbath after his death—Being
