DOINGS IN CONGRESS.—We feel that we have a right to congratulate our readers on the first step made by the House of Representatives in the business proper of the Extra Session, by the passage of the bill uniting the measures of the distribution of the proceeds of the sales of lands among the States, and a general proscriptive right of pre-emption to settlers on the public lands. There are some defects, perhaps, in the details of the bill, which it may be in power of the Senate to remedy. But, even with all its faults upon its head, we rejoice in its passage, as it establishes a principle (in our opinion) of vital importance. Its passage proves besides—what had become almost a matter of doubt among the people—that the House of Representatives has not lost all capacity of action; and that is something gained.

We consider this Land Bill as one of a series which are, or are not, to signalize this Session of Congress as one of the most important and most beneficial ever held. But, whether the residue of the series be matured or not, the passage of this bill alone would distinguish the present Congress in the Nation's history.

A number of Whigs, it will be seen, voted against this measure; all nine of the rejected representatives from Georgia, for example, who are opposed to it, independently of instructions to vote against it. Several other Whigs voted against it, generally because they deemed it premature in the present state of the business of Congress. We should probably have deemed it premature, too, but for the conviction that the corresponding measures for revenue will pass into the statute book in company with it. But
