DOINGS IN CONGRESS.—We feel that we have a right to congratulate our readers on the first step made by the House of Representatives in the business proper of the Extra Session, by the passage of the bill uniting the measures of the distribution of the proceeds of the sales of lands among the States, and a general proscriptive right of pre-emption to settlers on the public lands. There are some defects, perhaps, in the details of the bill, which it may be in power of the Senate to remedy. But, even with all its faults upon its head, we rejoice in its passage, as it establishes a principle (in our opinion) of vital importance. Its passage proves besides -- what had become almost a matter of doubt among the people—that the House of Representatives has not lost all capacity of action; and that is something gained.
