OBITUARY.

Died in Davidson county, Tenn. of bilious cholc, on the 29th September, 1341, BENJAMIN MORGAN, a soldier of the revolution, in the 79th year of his age.

Mr Morgan was a native of Fauquier county Virginia, where he resided many years, after he had bravely fought the battles of his country. He removed in 1805 to South Carolina, from which place, after having lost by death the wife of his youth, and his eldest son, he emigrated to Tennessee, where he arrived in 1826 - He continued his residence here, until the fatal disease freed his spirit from the turmoils of earth; his mortal remains were deposited by weeping kindred and friends, in their last resting place, at Springhill near Nashville, where they await the summons of the last trumpet. Fully aware of his approaching end, he sunk composed and resigned to the tomb, in the perfect exercise of all his mental faculties. - He left to lament his departure several sons and daughters, and numerous grandchildren, with a large circle of other relatives and friends, in Virginia, and ma-
