He has directed that every man, in the event of a call, shall report himself, furnished with good arms, eight days provision, and one hundred rounds of ammunition, and prepared for three months service from the time when they may report themselves at the head quarters of the army.

Arista has also issued his proclamation, urging the Texians to hold still. It is dated at Monterey, on the 6th of January.—Well might our correspondents inform us that 50,000 Mexicans were ready to take the field.

We learn from Capt. Wright of the New York, that it is the intention of the Texians to "keep dark" until the Mexicans cross the Colorado, and then give them a San Jacinto fight with an army of from 5 to 7,000 men. God send that they may bayonet every "yellow belly" in the Mexican army. Wonder if Houston will save Santa Anna a second time?

FORGERY.

Mr. Ambrose Spencer, Jr. a son of the Secretary of War, was arrested in this city on the 15th inst. on the charge of forging the name of his father to two checks, amounting to \$500, which he passed upon Mr. Gardner of the City Hotel, New York. His examination was not concluded till Monday last, when he was committed.
