William Rogers did feloniously assault one Andrew Givens, with intention him, the said Andrew Givens, to kill and murder, by *stabbing*; and whereas, it is further represented, that the said William Rogers was committed to the common jail of Rankin county aforesaid by legal authority, to wait his trial for said offence. from which jail the said William Rogers, on or about the third day of March, A. D. 1842, escaped, and is now a fugitive from justice: And whereas, the good order and safety of society, require that the said William Rogers should be apprehended, secured and brought to trial. I do, therefore, issue this my proclamation, and do hereby offer a reward of one hundred dollars to any person or persons who may apprehend and secure in any jail in the United States of America, the said William Rogers: And I do hereby charge and require all officers of this State, both civil and military, to aid and assist in bringing the said William Rogers to answer the charge made against him.
 Given under my hand and the great seal of L. s: the State, at the city of Jackson, this eighteenth day of March, A. D. 1842.
