FEMALE INSTITUTE.

The next session of this Institute will be opened on the second Monday in July next, in the large and commodious building now used for the Public School. The principal having completed arrangements with the Trustees for its occupation during the term of five years and six months, has made already, extensive preparations for the expenditure, upon it and the grounds, of \$1500. The house will be thoroughly finished in time for the reception of pupils, twenty five of whom can be accommodated immediately with board, lights, fuel, and washing.

The associate Principal, the Rev. A. P. MERRILL and other teachers will reside in the Institute with the boarders and thus form one family, a family in which all the solicitudes of parental anxiety and care shall be exercised. Mrs. MERRILL, who is peculiarly happy in management, winning the affections of the pupils at the same time she is enforcing an uncompromising discipline, will be specially engaged in the well ordered home. The Boarder's attention shall be directed to the various branches of Domestic Economy, whereby relief will be given to their literary pursuits. They shall be required to attend somewhat to their wardrobe to keep every article of their apparel in perfect neatness, and arranged in order. Plain needle work shall have its due share of attention. Every article of dress must be distinctly marked with the full name of the young lady, and her half-dozen towels, required to be brought by her, properly numbered. Boarders will not be allowed to go shopping without one of the ladies of the Institute, who will superintend their purchases; and not then, except when Parents or Guardians shall have left instruction to permit such shopping.

No boarder will be allowed to leave the grounds unless by express permission or in company with some one of the teachers. The young ladies however will not be deprived of any privilege or pleasure which they would enjoy in any well regulated private family, and it is hoped that the efforts which will be made to promote their happiness, and the care that will be exercised over their manners, morals and general deportment, together with the advantages which will result from their being punctual in their attendance, (as sickness can be the only excuse for non attendance when boarding in the house where the school is taught,) will be an inducement for parents to place their daughters in the institute.

It is not intended to debar the young ladies the enjoyment of the good society which the town affords. Company will be, occasionally, invited to the Institute with the designed view of the improvement and gratification of the family. Boarders shall attend the church, to which their Parents or guardians shall have directed they shall go.
