The State of Mississippi: Marshall County
In the name of God. Amen.

I, Sarah M. Davis being of sound mind & memory do make & ordain this my last will & testament. First I give my soul to God who gave it, and that all my burial & funeral expenses be paid and also all the debts which I may owe, out of any moneys which I may die possessed of. I severally will give and bequeath unto my living mother Susan Davis all of my personal property to have the same during her natural life, which property consisted at the time of two negro girls, one named Ann about eighteen years old, the other Martha about fifteen years old, with some money and cash notes whatever amount I may die possessed of and at the death of my beloved mother I will and bequeath to my ~~beloved father~~ ~~Thomas Davis~~ ~~Joseph A. Davis~~ ~~Thomas F. Davis~~ ~~John Davis~~ and to Thomas Franklin Davis the son of my deceased brother Franklin Davis an equal share of said property with all of the annual interest and to the end that an equal distribution shall be made between those above mentioned at the death of my mother. I will that the property to be sold and the proceeds be equally divided amongst those above mentioned if they all survive. If any of them should die without issue then the whole of the property to survive to and be divided amongst the survivors equally. It is my will that my brother Thorton Davis if he survives after the death of my mother shall be the guardian and take possession of the portion of property to which my nephew Thomas Franklin Davis will be entitled and keep manage and direct the same faithfully for him until the said son of Thomas Franklin shall arrive at sufficient age to choose his own guardians. I do make constitute & appoint my living brother Thorton Davis Executor of this my last Will & Testament in testimony of all which I have this day the 20th February 1843 here set my hand and affixed my seal.
