In the name of God, Amen, I James Jones in the County  
of Wards and State of Mississippi, being of sound mind  
and memory, and considering the uncertainty of this frail and transitory life,  
do hereby make, ordain, publish and declare this to be my last will and  
testament, that is to say, first, after all my lawful debts are paid, and  
discharge the residue of my estate, real and personal, I give bequeath and  
dispose of as follows, to wit, to my beloved wife Mary, Thompson, Waring,  
Reed, Wing, and Hunter, and also one thousand dollars to buy a negro  
girl, and one thousand dollars to be applied in buying a horse, this  
property to be hers during the term of her natural life or widowhood, and  
after her death to be divided equally among my heirs, to my son J. W.  
Jones one negro boy named Sam, when he marries or at the death of his mother  
to my son J. M. Jones one negro boy named Bob, one horse and saddle  
worth one hundred and twenty five dollars when he comes of age, and also  
to have possession of Bob when he marries or at the death of his mother  
to my daughter Cornelia & Jones one negro girl Livada, when she marries  
or at the death of her mother, also one horse and saddle, worth one  
hundred and twenty five dollars, to my son Wm. C. Jones negro boy named Andy  
also one horse and saddle, worth one hundred and twenty five dollars, when  
he comes of age, to my sister Rachel Jones one hundred dollars to be given to her  
in the way and in the manner I make, constitute and appoint my said son J. W.  
Jones & Jonathan & Son to be executors of this my last will and testament,  
I in writing whereof I have hereunto subscribed my name and affixed my seal  
the fifth day of February one thousand eight hundred and sixty  
Fort G. P. Kemp, James Hunt, John Kirby— James Jones (Seal)
