

18.1 Sherrwood Smith Deceased
Last Will & Testament

I Sherrwood Smith of the Co. of Madison
do make and Ordain this my last
will and Testament in manner and form following Viz. I
give on to B D Smith two notes fifty Dollars each and my
horse, bridle and saddle and farming quintail and
five heads of cattle and one beast and furniture and
the South half of an eight of land a young red Smith &
I give on to my daughter Cathy Smith one Cow and Cat &
and give to Poly Elder one Whist. I give on to my son
and to Elijah Smith the Balance of the eight of land and
one Beast and furniture also seventeen Dollars &
seventy five Cents which be the said Elijah owes me
I give ~~the~~ one son son Thomas Smith a twenty five dollar
note M. & C. note against him & I
give next to my daughter Sarah Perry one Beast
I give into the hands of my dearly beloved Wife
Yule one dollar in money I give into my two sons
Sherrwood and Isaac Smith living in Denver a note
on Josiah Bellamy for twenty three dollars and a note
on William H M Swain for about twenty six dollars
which is in the hands of Papil Rigus in Den I
leave my two sons Philip & Richard who move to
Illinois some years ago one dollar each. The balance
of my effects I leave in the hands of B D & Elijah
Smith to pay off & discharge my debts & after my
debts is all satisfied if there is a remainder I will
& bequeath that it shall be equally divided between
them both in addition to what I have given them
hereby revoking all other & former wills by me at
any time heretofore made. In Witness Whereof

the 30th day of August in the year of our
Lord 1840
