### **Dr. Robert Lee Houston, Jr.**

Dr. Robert Lee Houston, Jr., age 60, died suddenly December 26 at his home on the lake in the Snowdown community. He was retired from the Medical Corps of Engineers at the Marine Hospital, now known as the Public Health Service Out-Patient Hospital in Memphis. Dr. Houston was a member of the Church of Christ.

Funeral services were held December 28 at 11 a.m. at Cutshall Funeral Home with Bro. James A. Pilgrim officiating. Graveside services followed at Forrest Hill Cemetery in Memphis, with Bro. Pate conducting.

Survivors include his widow, Mrs. Audry M. Houston, of Iuka and Memphis; two sons, Robert Earl Houston of Memphis and Gene Houston, who is stationed in Vietnam; one step-daughter, Mrs. J. E. Lucas, of Memphis, Tenn., and one step-son, H. F. Rushing, of Verona, Miss.; two grandchildren and 4 step grandsons; one sister, Mrs. Virginia Dowey, of Middleton, Tenn.; and two brothers, Wesley Houston of Texas and Dewey Houston of Middleton, Tenn.
